The information needs of clients are a determining factor in the design and implementation of an evaluation. However, there are other factors that should be taken into account when planning an evaluation, including those conceptual concepts that are relevant to the approach that is most likely to produce the information required. In this seminar John will draw in some examples from recent practice to illustrate how these concepts can add to the quality of responsive evaluation approaches. These examples are drawn from the spectrum of contemporary evaluation practice.
