- clearance indicator (output);
- complaints (output);
- backlog (output);
- attendance indicator (output);
- judicial resources (input); and
- cost per case (input)

#### Response to problems of performance measured

#### • Displacement

- Use for both accountability and performance improvement
- Volume not quality; Perversity
  - Include higher level performance measures (outcome as well as output)
- Timescales
  - Use of process and output as well as outcome indicators
- Cost
  - Dual use
  - Involvement of all levels of organisation
- Target levels
