

Better stewardship of evaluation capital can help deepen democracy

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Key messages:

- The investment made in evaluation seldom delivers a good return, mainly because it fails to connect adequately with the other elements needed for social and other kinds of change.
- To avoid obsolescence and extinction it needs to do better. Better stewardship of evaluation capital is a strategy that could help.
- Responsible investment means taking a systems view of the discipline by ensuring inclusion, dialogue and deliberation.





UK Financial Council's Investment Stewardship Principles

An investor should:

- Publically disclose a policy on how it discharges stewardship principles
- Have a publicly disclosed policy on the management of conflicts of interest
- Monitor companies in which it is invested
- Adopt clear guidelines on when and how stewardship activities will be escalated
- Indicate a clear willingness to act collectively with other investors when appropriate
- Adopt a clear policy on voting and disclosure of voting activity
- Report periodically on stewardship and voting activities.

Evaluation: Go beyond evidence!

- Enabling citizens to think evaluatively (as a form of process use) is far more durable than "findings" and "recommendations" and can help address democratic deficits arising from the representative system.
- As RI focuses on "ESG", responsible evaluation should promote:
 - Inclusion
 - Dialogue and
 - Deliberation.

Types of use

Instrumental Use: Evaluation findings inform, decision making and lead to changes in the intervention. Direct action is taken as a result of an evaluation

Conceptual Use: The evaluation results in an improved understanding of an intervention. Something new is learned about of the intervention and its context

Enlightenment Use: The evaluation adds knowledge to a field beyond the programme


Symbolic Use: Evaluations are done to justify an already existing position and to legitimise decisions that have already been taken.

Process Use: The value derived through stakeholders participating in the planning and implementation of evaluations
