WHAT ARE WE EVALUATING?

HYPOTHESIS:

The YIP early intervention model reduces the demand on the youth justice service system



The Armadale Youth Intervention Partnership is an effective and efficient early intervention system that provides the right support, to the right young people at the right time and reduces demand on the youth justice services system.



INDIVIDUAL SUB-HYPOTHESIS:

The Armadale Youth Intervention Partnership prevents or reduces young people exposure to the juvenile justice services system.



The YPP has developed a 3 phase assessment model based on collective impact literature, to assess the extent the YIP Model increases **capacity** & **connection** of early intervention service system




Developmental Evaluation is an approach that facilitates 'real-time' feedback to partners thus facilitating a **continuous development loop.**







The Youth Partnership Project defines young people with complex needs as young people, who experience the hard indicators listed below, and any additional risk factors:

	SITUATIONAL RISK FACTORS	INDIVIDUAL RISK FACTORS
HARD INDICATORS	 A young person who is related to, associated with or seen with an offender; or who is a witness to or associated with offending. A young person living in a conflicting home environment, as indicated by: a. referrals to DoC-CPFS for child protection concerns (including Family and Domestic Violence); and/or b. being subject to a safety & wellbeing assessment; and/or c. being in the care of DoC-CPFS 	A young person who has: a. School attendance rate below 59% over 24 months,¹ and/or b. 8+ suspensions and/or a total of 30 days suspension, and/or c. Involved in critical incidences, including physical assault or intimidating/threatening behaviour
SOFT	 A young person experiencing social disadvantage; such as unemployed carers, homelessness or housing stress, family breakdown, transience, lower socioeconomic families or primary carers identified as having issues with mental health, alcohol or other 	 A young person presents with mental health concerns e.g. depression, anxiety, conduct disorders and/or alcohol and substance abuse A young person who, if at school, is Not coping in classroom situations;

Review & Refinement



Connection to a relative/associate with high offending is probably more relevant then a current PPO



Young People in Care wouldn't be picked up, because their school attendance would be monitored by case worker.

However, being in care places young people at significant risk of entering justice system.



Attendance Rate over 2 years will more accurately depict risk, then a point in time.



Critical incident reports aren't connected to individual students

Students who attend but are significantly disengaged are also at high risk



Evaluation



Retrospective Analysis: Qualitative assessment from YIP Partners resulted on:

- New process to implement the tool.
- Reduce/edit list of hard indicators.

Next Steps:

1. Formal partnership with Treasury in Western Australia- Social Investment Data Resource.
